TROOP GOALS:

GOLD: A GOLD RIBBON & TROOP CERTIFICATE; EARN 70 OF 70 POINTS.

**SILVER: A SILVER RIBBON WILL BE AWARDED TO ANY TROOP
EARNING 68-65 POINTS.**

BRONZE: ANY TROOP PARTICIPATING AND EARNING 59-63 POINTS.

EACH REQUIREMENT IS WORTH ONE POINT FOR EACH DAY IT IS COMPLETED. SOME REQUIREMENTS MAY ONLY BE AVAILABLE ON SPECIFIC DAYS, OR MAY BE DONE DURING THE WEEK, BUT SCORED ONLY ON FRIDAY. AN SPL OR ADULT LEADER IS REQUIRED TO BE IN THE CAMPSITE DURING COMMISSIONER VISIT OR NO VISIT/NO POINTS.

1. Latrine area: Floor swept, hosed down, paper available, wash area shelf clean, broom stored bristles up, no debris on outside of latrine.					
2. Tent area: Tents neat & swept, no clothes/paper on floor, inside clothesline permitted for dry clothing only & tied to the two upright poles, nothing attached to tent ties; nothing hanging on outside of tent. Nothing can come in contact with tent canvas. Stakes/outriggers must be secured.					
3. Campsite area: No food, paper, cans, glass, or any foreign material on the ground, Clotheslines hung between trees (not from tent to tent or tent to tree and not a tripping hazard). Troop equipment stored properly & first aid kit easily accessible. Campsite area look presentable, always.					
4. Fire extinguisher is readily accessible at the campsite latrine.					
5. Campfire area: Clean and safe (no tripping hazards) dedicated water at firebowl, always. Wood stacked neatly and covered with plastic or canvas. 5 foot radius raked area around firepit.					
6. Emergency procedures: Reviewed with troop on Sunday, posted, initialed by SM & SPL prior to Monday's commissioner's visit.					
7. Fireguard plan: Duty roster posted, all entries filled out for entire week ahead of time and initialed daily prior to commissioner's visit.					
8. American Flag: Always displayed properly in campsite					
9. Axe yard: A large enough axe yard constructed, identified with a gate & perimeter. Wood tools hung or stored properly; wood stacked neatly, no tripping hazards & wood tools usage and rules posted.					
10. Scout spirit: Show spirit at camp formations. Never be late for colors.					
11. Patrol Flies: Troop and/or patrol flies properly placed over tables.					
12. Respect neighbors: Be as quiet as possible after 10pm. Scout showers not permitted after 10pm. Campfires permitted but with low noise level.					
13. Weekly activities: Post all camp \$ troop events for the week.					
14. Daily Duties: Accomplish satisfactory in a timely manner.					
15. Vespers service: Attendance at the Wednesday evening vespers service.					
16. Participate in or host an inter-campsite campfire with another troop and/or Camp Rotary staff. (earned any day, limit to one point)					
17. Troop or patrol leads song or skit: at meal or Friday campfire (1pt)					
18. Camp improvement/conservation project: Discussed/approved by Ranger. No time requirement. (1pt)					
19. Pioneering projects: Nat par of gateway, axe yard, or campfire bowl. Minimum of 3 projects. Need to be completed by Friday AM. (1pt)					
20. Gateways: Troop and Patrols properly identified. Evaluation based on creativity, correct lashings, and scope of project. Project is on-going throughout the week and must be completed by Friday AM. (1pt)					
21. Camp Policy: No vehicle or electric use violations
