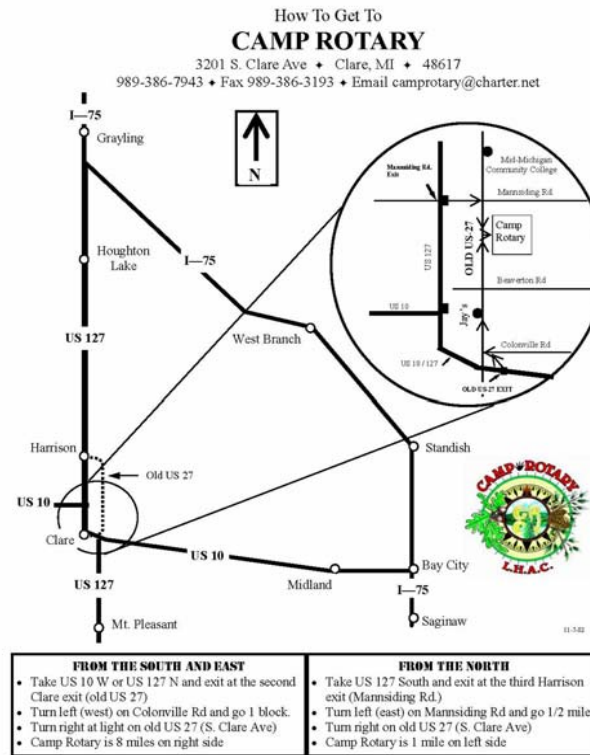

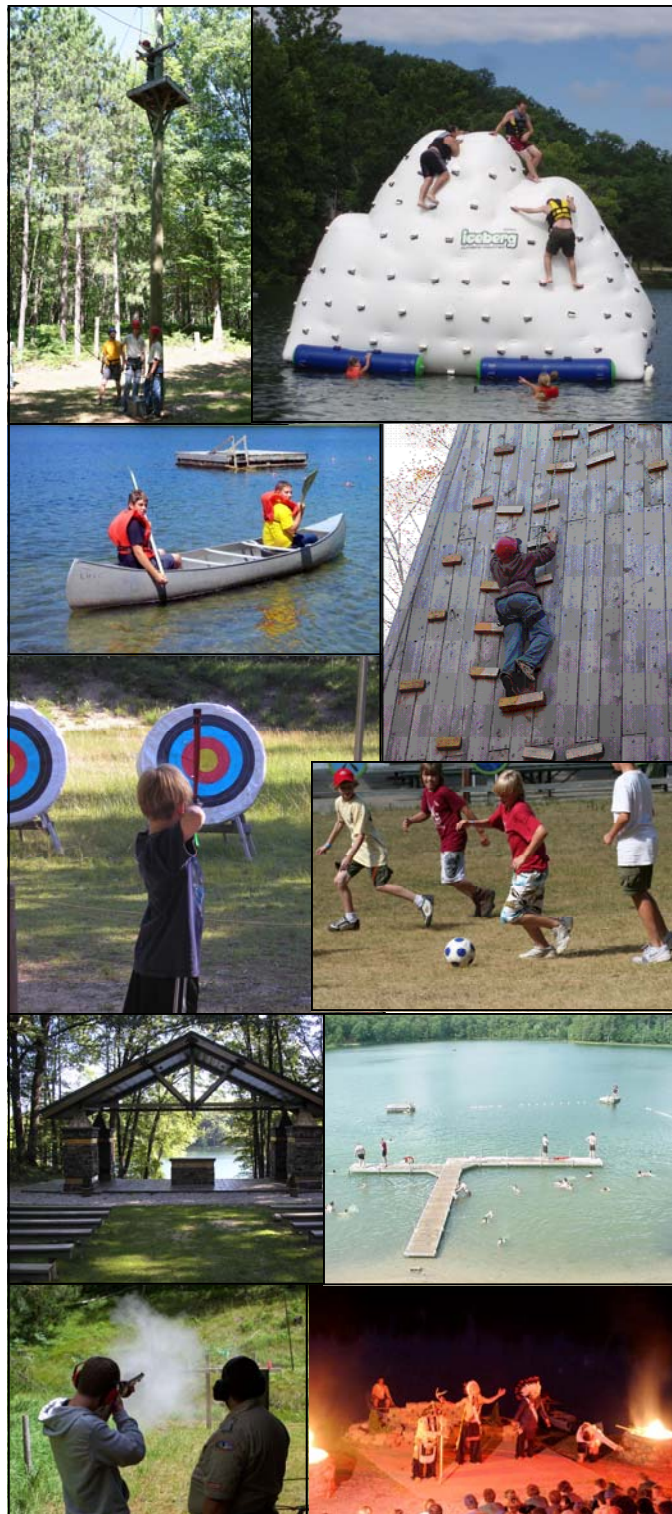
CAMP ROTARY
