

High Adventure Activities at PBSR, p.2

C. Drop-in Activities. Just drop in at any of these during any activity period and have fun!

<p>Extreme Pioneering & Huge Water Balloon Fight</p>	<p>Each Stake will be assigned to one of two hill-tops where you will build fortresses with look-out towers, bridges, and catapults. Work all week to build your fortress and water weapons of war. Then on Friday afternoon the two groups will battle it out with a huge water balloon battle.</p> <p>Construction is limited only by your imagination (and certain safety restrictions.) Think Swiss Family Robinson compound! You may want to build your own shelter here to sleep in (which will also fulfill a Wilderness Survival MB requirement if you are taking that.)</p> <p>PBSR will supply the poles and rope for the construction and one barrel for each Stake for storing filled water balloons. Scouts must bring their own balloons to fill. Bring as many as you want to throw, and maybe bring some buckets to hold them.</p>
<p>Mountain Biking</p>	<p>Experience the excitement of maneuvering through Michigan forestland trails and hills. Go at your own pace or race for time on a new biking trail. The fastest times will be awarded on Friday. PBSR will provide a core of 10 to 12 mountain bikes, but you are also encouraged to bring your own with your helmet. To use the PBSR bikes, you will need to sign up for a time slot when you get to camp.</p>
<p>Climbing Tower</p>	<p>Have fun climbing the 32-foot tower and then rappelling back to the bottom. Try your skills on each face and then ask the staff to suggest the toughest climb. The climbing tower will be open for free climbing during all activity periods – the climbing merit badge will not be offered in order to maximize climbing time for everyone.</p>
<p>Spar Pole Climbing</p>	<p>Have you ever climbed straight up a 26-ft wooden pole with spikes on your feet and a climbing belt around your waist? Now is your chance! This place ain't called Paul Bunyan Scout Reservation for nothin'! Try out this manly lumberjack challenge!</p>
<p>Geocaching</p>	<p>Search for hidden treasure using modern GPS technology. You can also hide your own geocache, register its location, and later see how many other scouts found it. PBSR has 11 GPS units for us to use, and you are also encouraged to bring your own.</p>
<p>Paintball Adventure</p>	<p>Grab a Paintball Gun, a GPS, and your Crew or Team and see if you can survive the PBSR Paintball Adventure starting at Scoutcraft. Test your Scouting skills and knowledge, teamwork, and your aim while navigating through a “chase your own adventure” style expedition. AWSOME!</p>
<p>Soccer & Volleyball</p>	<p>Do you love sports? PBSR has its own a soccer field and sand volleyball court where we will have some tournaments or you can play pick-up games. Which Stake will win the coveted Varsity Cup? You are welcome to bring your own balls and soccer cleats.</p>
<p>Disc Golf</p>	<p>Come and try your hand at disc golf with PBSR's newly expanded 7-hole course. It is much more than Frisbee. If you have never played before, come learn the game with its different discs called drivers, mid-range, and putters.</p>
<p>Waterfront & Open Swim</p>	<p>Do you want to just go cool off and have fun playing in the water? The waterfront will have lots of open swim time. All traditional Scout waterfront activities will be available on the 30 acre Lake Paul.</p>
<p>Merit Badges</p>	<p>Do you need some final merit badges for your Eagle. Or do you just want to try something new? You can probably do it at PBSR! The camp has an open merit badge program with counselors and resources at each program area to help you complete the merit badges you want at your own pace and schedule.
