The "Camp Rotary Youth Mentor Program" is designed to assist Older Scouts in their Long Term Camping Experience, to achieve a higher level of leadership and example. It is our intent to assist these Older Scouts, by giving them these opportunities as well as the environment, in which to further develop their skills as an ever maturing and growing young man.

During his stay at camp, we will provide Older Scout _____, opportunities to assist in delivering to Younger Scouts, an enhanced experience in Outdoor Scouting, as well as assisting them along Scoutings Advancement trail. He is to select among the following tasks, 10 items that he will achieve during his week in camp. The achievement of these 10 items will assist other "Younger Scouts" in their growth and provide them with a more positive experience while at camp, as well as allowing the Older Scout an opportunity to broaden his development, while giving back to the program for all that he has achieved in his own life.

As an item is selected and achieved, it is to be attested to being achieved by either an adult in his troop or a staff member of the camp, which ever is the most appropriate. (If the item takes place within a program area of the camp, then a staff member should attest it to. If the item takes place within the unit operation, then an adult member of his troop should attest to it.)
